COURSE OBJECTIVE:

The objective of this course is to help you develop sufficient skills and knowledge that will enable you to participate in the game of tennis. Tennis is a game for the ages that can be played throughout a lifetime.

COURSE CONTENT:

The class will consist of demonstrations and practice of skills used in tennis. Also the class will incorporate cardio tennis techniques, speed

agility ladders, jump rope, hand/eye coordination drills, and stretching core pilates movements.

DRESS:

Wear comfortable clothing that allows you to move; including tennis shoes specifically for court surfaces. No sandals, flip-flops or boots will be permitted on the courts. Inappropriate dress may lead to an unexcused absence.

COURSE EVALUATION AND GRADING
