BIOGRAPHY

David M. Watry was born in Madison and raised in Janesville, Wisconsin. He graduated from Janesville Craig High School. Watry studied Philosophy, Political Science, and Theology under the Jesuits and earned his B.A. degree from Marquette University. He is still a fan of the Green Bay Packers and Marquette Golden Eagles. In 1989, Watry moved to the great state of Texas and worked in banking and investments throughout the 1990s. In 2001, he became a full-time graduate student in the Department of History at The University of Texas at Arlington and worked as a graduate teaching assistant and as a graduate research assistant. Watry received his M.A. in History (2004) and his Ph.D. in Transatlantic History (2011) from The University of Texas at Arlington. His dissertation, *Transatlantic Brinkmanship: The Anglo-American Alliance and Conservative Ideology, 1953-1956*, won the George Wolfskill Award for Outstanding Dissertation in Transatlantic History in 2012. The dissertation was also nominated for the prestigious 2013 Council on Graduate Studies/ProQuest Distinguished Dissertation in the Humanities/Fine Arts Award and was published by ProQuest. A book, *Diplomacy at the Brink: Eisenhower, Churchill, and Eden in the Cold War* was published by Louisiana State University Press in December, 2014. This book has been described as provocative, groundbreaking, important, well-written, and exhaustively researched. It re-examines the Anglo-American relationship at the height of the Cold War with original research and a new analysis of Eisenhower, Churchill, and Eden. *Diplomacy at the Brink* is being advertised in at least 20 different languages around the globe. Another book is planned, *Anthony Eden's Diplomacy: Making Peace in Geneva, 1954*, which will be an in-depth analysis of the Geneva Conference of 1954 that led to the division of Vietnam.
