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*\*COURSE DESCRIPTIONS*

- GOVT 2301* First semester course covering the origin and development of constitutional democracy (United States and Texas), federalism and intergovernmental relations, local governmental relations, local government, parties, politics, and political behavior.
- GOVT 2302* The three branches of the United States and Texas government are studied. Topics include the legislative process, the executive and bureaucratic structure, the judicial process, civil rights and liberties, and domestic policies. Other topics include foreign relations and national defense.
- GOVT 2305* A survey of the political system of the United States including: the United States Constitution, the three branches of government, political theory, political parties, interest groups and the media. This course is required for graduation and teacher certification.
- GOVT 2306* A survey of the state and local political structures of Texas including: the geographical and political environment of Texas, the three branches of state government, the federal system, county and municipal governments, special districts, the Texas Constitution and a comparison of Texas' political system with other states. This course is required for graduation and teacher certification.
- HIST 1301* A general survey of American history from the earliest discovery period through the Civil War and Reconstruction. This course is required for graduation and teacher certification.
- HIST 1302* A continuation of HIST 1301. A general survey of American history from the earliest discovery period from Reconstruction to the present. This course is required for graduation and teacher certification.
