Title: *À la recherche du Dasein féminin: sexe, technique, et génération* (In Search of Female Dasein: Sex, Technology, and Generation)

Brief summary: The search for female Dasein is an inquiry into the symbiotic relationship between woman and her (technological) environment as it unfolds during a certain historical time. In postulating the existence of a particular female temporality and a feminine way of being-in-the-world, this project contests Martin Heidegger's view that Dasein, in its neutrality, is neither of the two sexes.
