COURSES TAUGHT

HMS 589.001: Thesis Research (3 credits; Fall 2017)

This course is designed to be taken by thesis-bound graduate students in the School of Human Sciences, prior to the thesis writing course (HMS 590). During the course, students will form their thesis committee, design the thesis project, develop the literature review and methodology sections of the thesis, and complete various other steps toward the goal of completing the thesis.

The thesis will be used for assessment purposes for the School of Human Sciences.

HMS 575.002: Advanced Graduate Studies (3 credits; Summer II 2018)

Individual instruction. Prerequisite: School approval. (One to three credit hours).

HMS 485.001: Managing a Diverse Workforce (3 credits; Spring 2018; Spring 2016, 2017)

The course will explore the legal implications of operating a hospitality business with emphasis on the human resource interaction among supervisors, employees, guests, and owners. Additional materials will be used to present methodologies for recruitment, selection, orientation, training, disciplining, and discharging employees.

HMS 480.001: Hospitality Administration (3 credits; Fall 2018; Fall 2017; Fall 2016; Fall 2015)

Utilization of principles and components of the industry in effective administration. Coordination of resources in establishing policy, supervision and management, and decision making in the delivery of hospitality services.

HMS 478.002: Special Topic: Special Events Production (3 credits; Spring 2018)

In-depth study of selected topics within the discipline of human sciences. The management and operation of events, design, marketing, and promotion efforts. Identifying sponsors, marketing to attendees, exhibitors, and other participants. Prerequisite: school approval.

HMS 478.001: Special Topic: Meetings, Events, Expositions & Technology (3 credits; Fall 2017)

In-depth study of selected topics within the discipline of human sciences. This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, events, expositions and event technology industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEET industry. In addition, this course will include topics that will prepare the students to be successful in getting their Meeting and Event Technology Certification. This certificate program has been developed for students who are currently practicing or anticipating careers in meeting or event management. The certificate is designed to provide both training and education in meeting and event technology, as well as meeting planning. Prerequisite: school approval.

HMS 475.001: Special Problems (3 credits; Summer II 2018; Summer II 2017)

Individual instruction. Prerequisite: school approval. (One to three credit hours).

HMS 470.601: Meetings, Events, Expositions & Technology (MEET) (3 credits; Fall 2018)

This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, events, expositions and event technology industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEET industry.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences: Worldwide Experience at the Cannes Film Festival (3 credits; Maymester 2018; Maymester 2017)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities. This course was conducted during the Cannes Film Festival in Cannes, France.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences (3 credits; Fall 2016; Spring 2016; Fall 2015)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities.

HMS 426.001: Field Experiences in Human Sciences (Special Event Production; 3 credits; Spring 2016)

Exploration of various human sciences disciplines through foreign/domestic travel opportunities.

HMS 380.001: Lodging II (3 credits; Spring 2018; Spring 2017; Spring 2016)

Emphasis on principles of lodging management in the workplace. Classroom instruction and work site experiences in the management of guests, services, sales, financial management, security and personnel. The comprehension and construction of a profit and loss statement is a critical assessment of this course.

HMS 332.501: Communicating Human Sciences Content (3 credits; Fall 2018; Fall 2017; Summer II 2016; Summer II 2017; ONLINE)

Rationale, design delivery and evaluation of professional presentations for diverse audiences, instructional interaction, and product promotion.

HMS 322.501: Facility Planning/Management (3 credits; Summer II 2018; Spring 2018; Spring 2017; Fall 2016; ONLINE)

Overview of elements of design, building systems, construction techniques and space utilization in relation to safety and efficiency of service. Site location, energy conservation, fire protection, maintenance and upkeep as factors influencing retail, dining service and lodging accommodations. Prerequisite: Junior Standing.

HMS 302.001: Introduction to Lodging (3 credits; Fall 2018)

Focus on the principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations, guest expectations, food, beverage, and maintenance services, promotions, budget control, personnel and security.

HMS 302.001: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2017)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 302.301: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2018; ONLINE)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 302.501: Lodging 1 (3 credits; Fall 2016; Summer II 2016; Fall 2015; ONLINE)

Principles underlying operations in the vast hospitality industry. Concepts include residential and lodging operations; guest expectations; food, beverage and maintenance services; promotions; budget control; personnel; and security. Prerequisites: HMS 102; Junior standing or school approval.

HMS 102: Introduction to Hospitality Industry (3 credits; Summer II 2015; Online)

Overview of the vast scope of the industry, historical perspective, analysis of the industry as a profession, professional opportunities and future outlook.

HRTM 495: Hospitality Management Study Tour (1-6 hours; Fall 2013)

Broadening perspective and developing an understanding of the hospitality industry through visits. Tours to hospitality facilities, national food and equipment shows; food processors; equipment manufacturers; and trade exchanges.

HRTM 496/896: Independent Study (1-6 hours; Fall 2013, Fall 2014) – Graduate Course

Requires a contract with an individual HRTM faculty member. Letter grade only. Individual projects in research, literature review, and/or creative activity.

HRTM 396: Independent Study (1-6 hours; Spring 2013, Fall 2013, Summer 2014)

Requires a contract with an individual HRTM faculty member. Letter grade only. Individual projects in research, literature review, and/or creative activity.

HRTM 489/889: Advanced Event Operations (Spring 2011, 2012 (2 sections), 2013, 2014, 2015; Fall 2013) – Graduate Course

The management and operation of events, design, marketing, and promotion efforts. Identifying, sponsors, marketing to attendees, exhibitors, and other participants. Pre-reqs: HRTM 289.

HRTM 485/885: Advanced Lodging Operations (Spring 2011, 2012)

Senior management techniques required to operate a lodging facility applying strategic and critical thinking with case study analysis to solve problems. Requires field trips to local lodging facilities. Pre-reqs: HRTM 285 – Graduate Course

HRTM 285: Introduction to the Lodging Industry (Fall 2010, 2011; Summer 2014)

Fundamentals of the lodging industry including characteristics and management of hotel/motel/resort properties through basic understanding of accounting, housekeeping, engineering, front desk, and guest services.

HRTM 289: Introduction to the Event Industry (Fall 2010, 2011, 2013; Spring 2013, 2014, 2015; Summer 2014)

This course will introduce students to those concepts and topics necessary for the comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of the meetings, conventions, events, and exposition industries. The course will review the roles of the organizations and people involved in the businesses that comprise the MEEC industry.

HRTM 109: Travel and Tourism (Fall 2007, 2008)

Survey of travel and tourism; focus on concepts, terminology, demographics, financial significance and trends.

HRTM 204: Facility Management (Spring 2008, 2009, 2010; Fall 2009)

Fundamentals of the role, cost, design, maintenance and management of hospitality and health care facilities. Emphasis on the concept and interface of building systems, trends, sustainability, safety, wastewater, electrical, illumination, food service equipment, heating, ventilation and air conditioning. Prereq: Math 105 with a minimum grade of "C". Restr: Hospitality Management and Dietetics majors or permission of instructor. To enroll in any Hospitality Management course numbered 300 and above, a student must be in Upper Division and meet course prerequisites. Not all courses are offered every semester.

HRTM 310: Lodging Management (Spring 2008, 2009, 2010)

Introduction to the organization, function, and management of lodging operations. Restr: Hospitality Management majors or permission of instructor.

HRTM 402: Beverage Management (Fall 2007, 2008, 2009)

Pairing of beverages with food, beverage facility design and purchase contracts, service and social issues, menu development, special event promotions, on-premise merchandising and training of staff. Emphasis on responsible alcohol beverage service and management techniques. Restr: Hospitality Management majors or permission of instructor.

HRTM 407: Special Events/Convention Sales (Fall 2008, 2009; Spring 2010)

Concepts of management related to the effective organization and operation of convention sales and special events. Skills and competencies application in hospitality management. Emphasis on event management and promotion. Prereq or coreq: HRTM 308. Restr: Hospitality Management majors or permission of instructor.

HRTM 410: Front Desk Operations (Spring 2008, 2009, 2010)

Principles and theories of front desk operations in hotels. Prereq: HRTM 310. Restr: Hospitality Management majors or permission of instructor.

HRTM 441: Resource Systems for Human Resources Related Occupations (Fall 2007)

Development and administration of training program in dietetics, hospitality management and merchandising occupations. Training presentation required. Restr: Hospitality Management majors with senior standing.
